"Lily of the Mohawks"

Did you know.....

- St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a Saint by the Catholic Church.
- She was born in 1656, in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon (Auriesville, NY);
- She died April 17, 1680 near Montreal
- Her mother was an Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and who took a Mohawk chief for her husband.
- As a young girl, she learned the "Hail Mary" from her mother prior to being orphaned, scarred and nearly blinded by small pox epidemic
- St. Kateri is Patron of the Environment AND Patron of Native Americans
