Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Cursillo

Would you like to attend a cursillo weekend? Maskwacis (formerly Hobbema) is hosting two weekends in October. Women - October 4-7, 2018 Men - October 11-14, 2018

What does Cursillo mean?

The original Spanish full name is "Cursillo de Cristiandad" which means short course in Christianity. It originated in Spain after World War II by a group of seven young soldiers who needed to find meaning from life and a renewal of spirituality. It is now termed Cursillo and the focus is on showing Christian laypeople how to share with the community the essence of Christianity and Christian values and in this way gradually transform the community from within. The major emphasis is to ask participants to take what they have learned back into the world. The NCCC or Native Conference of Catholic Cursillos is recognized by the CCCC or Canadian Conference of Catholic Cursillos, which is part of the international movement. It is a movement that encourages people to deepen their relationship with God with a greater faith and love.

The Native Catholic Cursillo is held as two retreat type weekends starting from Thursday to Sunday. One weekend is for the Men and one weekend is for the Women. Once the registration is completed on Thursday evening everyone participating stays on-site for the full weekend and do not leave the building. The people attending bring a mattress, pillows, blankets, towels, toiletries, personal medication and for smokers, enough cigarettes to last. Bring casual clothing to wear with a dressier outfit for Sunday.

Registration begins at 7 PM on the Thursday the Cursillo starts. The closing Mass may be attended by family and friends and it is conducted in the gym. It usually starts at 4:00 PM on Sunday.

The candidates accepted can also be from other cultures and is not restricted to Indigenous people. To attend the Cursillo, you may show up and register at the site on that Thursday and pay the \$30 fee. However, it is recommended that you seek out a sponsor to submit an application form prior to the weekend. A sponsor is a person who has taken the Cursillo previously. The fee is usually paid by the sponsor.

The St. Paul Prayer Group based out of the Sacred Heart of the First Peoples is encouraging people to attend the adult Cursillo in Maskwacis in October, 2018. This is to have more sponsors available for the Sacred Heart Cursillo being planned for 2019 and to have support of the Cursillo because of knowledge of it.

Members of the St. Paul Prayer Group and other Cursillistas are open to questions and to be sponsors. They are Fr. My name is Eugene Mwape Mule. I was born and raised in a town called Luanshya in the Copperbelt province of Zambia. I am the third child in a family of five. My parents and four siblings, Oliver, Joseph, Memory, and Hardley are all back in my home country of Zambia.

I joined the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate in February of 2009 in Zambia's capital city of Lusaka. A few months later after an experience in hospice ministry, I began my Philosophical Studies at St. Bonaventure College. After three years of studies, I was asked to go to the United States of America for another stage in our formation program which we call Novitiate. After this year long journey of getting to know myself better and learning to respond to the promptings of the Spirit, I made my first temporal vows, taking on the vows of Obedience, Poverty, Chastity, and Perseverance.

After Novitiate I went to Cameroon (a French speaking country in Western Africa) to pursue further formation and to experience cultural immersion. After two years of study in Cameroon, I returned to the USA (San Antonio, Texas) to complete my Theological studies.

SUNDAY READINGS: 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 16, 2018

First Reading: (Isaiah 50. 5-9)

The Lord God has opened by ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like fling, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near.

Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

Second Reading: (James 2. 14-18)

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you?

If a brother or a sister is without clothing and lacks daily food, and one of your says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm And eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith.

Gospel: (Mark 8. 27-35)

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they answered him "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the Prophets.

Jesus asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly.

And Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are thinking not as God does, but as humans do."

Jesus called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "Whoever wants to become my follower, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever loses their life for my sake, and for the sake of the Gospel, will save it"
